"I was holding onto his hand and realized I hadn't let go," she said. "He was very nice and very congenial. I was just excited but I didn't realize I would be that excited."

Bush went on to win the 1988 Presidential Election in a landslide ver Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis. After one term, Bush was defeated by Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton.

Bush's memoir of those years and his long life in public service, "All the Best, George Bush: My Life in Letters and Other Writings," was given to Senn as a gift by his parents. the worst day of the storm.


