Local Red Cross Preparing for Hurricane Florence Residents and Visitors Should Prepare

(Sept. 10, 2018 – CHARLOTTE, N.C.) – Volunteers and supplies have been mobilized as the American Red Cross works around the clock to prepare for the impact of Hurricane Florence. Additional volunteers are on standby for further deployment to support the coast of North Carolina, and many are on stand-by to respond within the Greater Carolinas region, which covers from Alamance County west to the state line.

Additional shelter and kitchen support trailers, meals, and clean up kits are en route.

“Hurricanes cause problems for people in coastal areas but these dangerous storms can also cause damage hundreds of miles inland as well,” said Angela A. Broome Powley, regional executive officer, American Red Cross Greater Carolinas Region. “We encourage our neighbors not to wait, but to prepare and be weather aware.”
WHAT YOU SHOULD DO
Build an emergency kit with a gallon of water per person, per day (recommended 3 days), non-perishable food, a flashlight, battery-powered radio, first aid kit, medications, supplies for an infant if applicable, a multi-purpose tool, personal hygiene items, copies of important papers, cell phone chargers, extra cash, blankets, maps of the area and emergency contact information. Many of these items are available through the Red Cross Store at redcrossstore.org. Talk with household members and create an evacuation plan. Practicing the plan minimizes confusion and fear during the event.
Have a communication plan. Identify someone outside the impacted area to call to check-in or leave messages.
Be informed. Listen to your local weather channel or follow NOAA weather reports. Learn about the community’s hurricane response plan. Plan routes to local shelters, register

Download the free Red Cross Emergency App to set severe weather and emergency alerts on a mobile device. The content includes expert guidance on what to do before, during and after different emergencies or disasters from home fires to hurricanes. The app can be found in smartphone app stores by searching for American Red Cross, texting ‘EMERGENCY’ to 90999, or by going to redcross.org/apps.

If you already have an emergency kit, now is the time make sure the food and water is still okay to consume and that copies of important documents are up to date. If you already have an emergency plan for your household, talk about it again with family members, so everyone knows what to do if an emergency occurs.

“We’re thankful for the dedication of volunteers who are willing to help those in need,” said Broome Powley. “If you would like to volunteer with the Red Cross, visit redcross.org/volunteer to learn more about the many volunteer opportunities and how to submit a volunteer application. This would allow you to not only help on large disasters like Hurricane Florence, but also when smaller disasters like home fires happen in our community”.

GIVE BLOOD: Visit redcrossblood.org to find a blood drive or collection location near you. Every 2 seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. It is important that the Red Cross has a sufficient blood supply on hand to meet the needs of patients every day and be prepared for emergencies of all types, including those that can disrupt blood drives or require blood or platelet transfusions. Natural disasters, such as flooding and hurricanes can make road travel hazardous, preventing blood and platelet donors from giving and resulting in blood drive cancellations. Blood can take up to three days to be tested, processed and made available for patients, so it's the blood already on the shelves that helps save lives in an emergency. Unlike many other lifesaving medical treatments, blood donations cannot be stockpiled. Red blood cells have a shelf-life of only 42 days and platelets just five days.



From the pen of Miles Gardner, whose *Murder and Mayhem in Old Kershaw: And in Nearby Sections of Lancaster, Kershaw and Chesterfield Counties* (2004) and its sequel, *Further Tales of Murder and Mayhem in Lancaster, Kershaw and Chesterfield Counties* (2006), brought long-buried skeletons out of their closets with their TRUE tales of blood feuds, unholy alliances and star-crossed relationships comes this new and even larger collection of tales. People and events that made the news locally during the past two and a half centuries come back to life in these pages. If you are a local, there's more than a good chance some of them are your relatives and that others are people you knew well (or you know their descendants). Get the lowdown on what Grandma refused to discuss, and find out what neighboring clans have known about your folks for years. With well over three hundred pages of text and with more than two hundred thirty illustrations, most of them never-before-seen photographs from private family or government archives, this volume proves the history of Kershaw and surrounding communities was anything but dull!
