

Medications Can Cause Hearing Loss

Ototoxic medications are medications that potentially damage the ear and cause hearing loss. There are at least 743 ototoxic medications out there. It is more common in adults who take medication on a regular basis or when two or more ototoxic medications are taken at the same time. These medications can cause damage to the inner ear, which is responsible for sending the sound signal to the brain for processing.

Some of the most common ototoxic medications are:

- Pain relievers such as ibuprofen, Advil, Motrin, Tylenol and aspirin.
- Narcotic analgesics such as painkillers like hydrocodone, lortab, and oxycodone
- Antibiotics such as aminoglycosides, erythromycin, vancomycin, gentamicin, streptomycin and neomycin, doxycycline used for

• Diuretics such as ethacrynate (Edecrin) furosemide (Lasix), bumetanide (Bumex) and bendroflumethazide used to treat heart failure, high blood pressure, liver and kidney disease.

• Cancer medications such as chemotherapeutic agents, cyclophosphamide, cisplatin and bleomycin.

• Men's health medication such as Viagra and CIALIS.

• Atenolol used for irregular heart beat.

• Quinine tablets such as chloroquine phosphate, quinacrine hydrochloride and quinine sulfate used to treat malaria and night cramps.

• Mucosal protectant such as misoprostol used to treat digestive disorders.

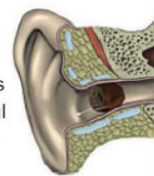
