Visitation was Monday at the Cowherd and Parrott Funeral Home.

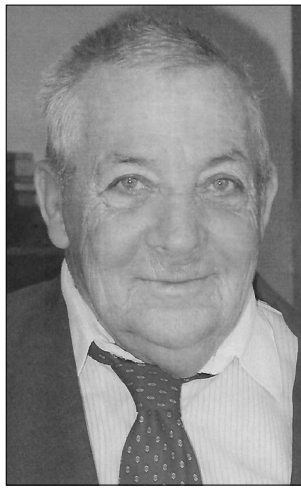

Everyone has their ups and downs. Very few people remain on an even keel, emotionally or spiritually.
