The Saturday before Thanksgiving was the traditional opening day of North Carolina's rabbit season.

As has been the case for years, the Horsemen Hunting Club met at Terrial White's farm in Chinquapin to share the camaraderie the

"We always start here," White said. "I mowed lanes so we could have a better hunt this year."

After a breakfast of sausage, bacon, grits and eggs warmed on an open fire, the hunters headed for a former hog pen.

"Iraised organic hogs for Whole Foods here," White said. "But, they moved their operations elsewhere."

The hog pens were webbed wire fencing. The mesh was big enough to allow a rabbit to pass through, not a beagle. White had mowed lanes along the edges of the fences so hunters and dogs to better negotiate thick underbrush and briers that had reclaimed the former pastures.

Within moments, the beagles sounded off. Numbering a couple of dozen, the beagles were owned by several of the hunters. While all of the others carried shotguns, White was recording the hunt with via cell phone video.

Within a half-hour, several hunters had missed shots at fleet-footed cottontails crossing the mowed trails or scooting across gaps in a soybean field. I missed a shot at a rabbit as it scampered into a blackberry thicket.
