But, he’s awfully glad they did.

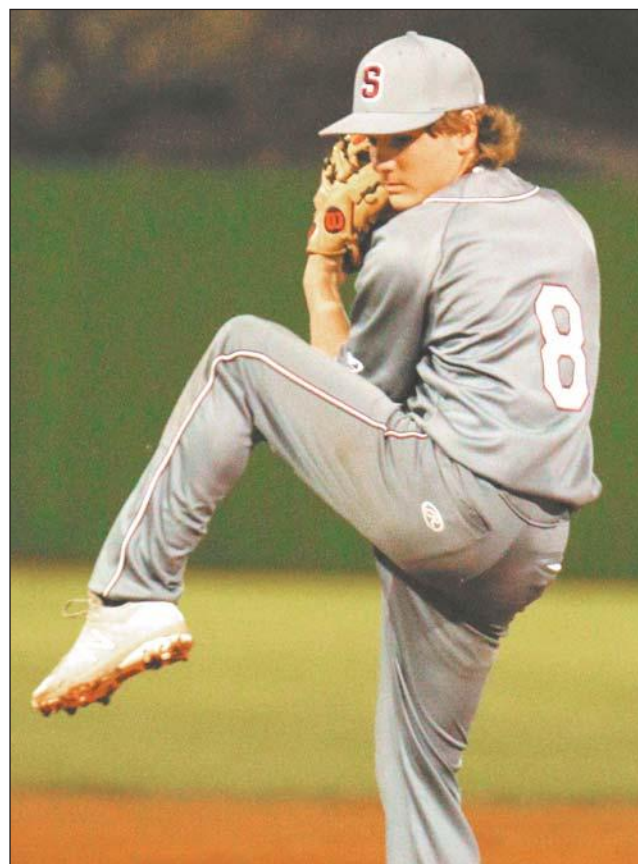
“I just heard they were opening up (the head coaching position), and this is where I ended
