## Stallion teams fall in holiday basketball tournament

A holiday trip to Lake Waccamaw was no vacation for the boy and girls varsity basketball squads from South Columbus High School, both teams 0-2 in the East Columbus Holiday Tournament.

### Boys

Facing the host Gator squad in the opening round, the Stallions seemed evenly matched early, taking a 7-5 lead into the second quarter before adding 13 points to claim a halftime lead of 18-15.

Coach Bryant Edward's Stallions continued impressive defensive play, with a 31-25 lead to end the third quarter.

But the Gators caught fire in the final period, seeming to score on almost every possession on the way to a 48-43 win for the home team.

Rajon Graham led the Stallions in scoring this night with 11.

Taking on Topsail in the consolation game the next night, the Stallions used pressure, quickness and a strong inside game to lead in the first quarter 14-10. Riley Hewitt hit two quick 3 pointers in the second quarter as Stallions continued their fast break approach to cement a 32-21 halftime lead.

Topsail regrouped during halftime and came out firing on all cylinders, creating turnovers to almost pull even with the Stallions at the end of the third with a score of 41-40.

It was all Pirates in the fourth quarter, the Topsail guards moving the ball and using their big size advantage to claim the 61-55 win.

Rajon Graham was the only Stallion named to All-Tournament team.

### Girls

Also playing the home team in the opening round, the Lady Stallions found themselves in a tight battle similar to their recent contest at South Columbus.

In the first quarter the Gators got the best of the Stallions leading 7-6, with the Stallions clawing back to take a 20-19 lead at halftime.

Carla Tuberville and Sarah Faulk were impressive for the Lady Stallions in the second half, bringing South Columbus to a 33-30 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Avenging their loss at South Columbus, the Lady Gators surged in the third quarter creating multiple turnovers to win 52-48.

From East to West, the Lady Stallions took on the Lady Vikings the following day in another evenly matched game, to start, the teams tied at 4 at the end of the first quarter.

There was more of the same in the second quarter, the Lady Stallions ahead 9-8 at halftime.

Allana Dill had a tremendous third quarter for West Columbus, the Lady Vikings heading into the fourth quarter ahead 26-17.

Dill and Ariana Daniels would have all the scoring for the Vikings as they would down the Lady Stallions for the second time this year with a score of 37-21.

Carla Tuberville was the lone Lady Stallion to make the All-Tournament Team.
