

Approach Happiness Indirectly



In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 11t is more blessed to give than to receive.

Acts 20: 35

We live in a world desperate for happiness. Some countries, such as Bhutan, now compute a Gross National Happiness index to keep track of how happy their nation is as a whole, as opposed to the Gross Domestic Product, which measures how productive

a nation is. There is certainly something to be said for trying to increase our levels of happiness, and for recognizing that a country's true wealth may be in the contentment of its citizens rather than in the material wealth or productivity of its farms and factories. But ironically, one sure way to miss out on happiness is to have happiness as one s primary goal in life. Happiness is more often a byproduct of an active, virtuous life. Many of us are happiest when we are most productive, so there might even be a connection between happiness and productivity. And finally, we are probably most likely to increase our own levels of happiness by working to increase the happiness (or alleviate the suffering) of others. Recentexperiments in social psychology have shown that people s moods are often elevated more by giving to others or buying something as a gift for someone else than by buying something for themselves. Perhaps the shortest route to happiness is in striving to make others happy.


