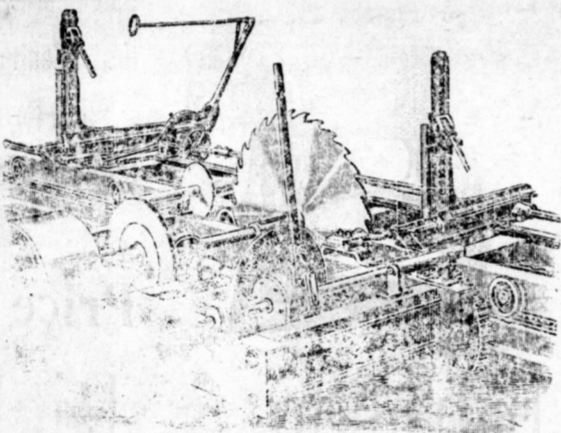

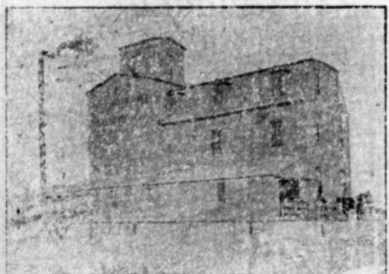

Gold in Red Lake River.

Thief River Falls is after a Klondike rush next spring and to start the ball rolling the News comes out with the following yarn:

"It has long been known to geologists that the entire northern portion of Minnesota bears traces of rich gold bearing rock and that it would not be surprising if at any time they should discover a vegetable Klondike in this section of the country. Along the Rainy river paying ore has been uncovered and the mining operations at that point are of more importance than is generally known to the public. Recent developments tend to bring the gold fever nearer home to Thief River Falls and it is not beyond the bounds of possibility that gold mining may replace logging as the principal industry of the Red Lake region.

While engaged in the improvement of the Red Lake river this fall, the crew of the logging fleet found a number of boulders remarkable alike for their great weight in comparison to their size and for their peculiar appearance. Nick Hanson, a member of the crew, took enough interest in the matter to secure one of the largest of these rocks, weighing about eight pounds, and send pieces of it to Duluth to be assayed. The expert there pronounced it a very rich specimen of gold bearing ore and expressed the greatest interest in the find.

The original rock is on exhibition at the store of Sam Cheely and has been examined with considerable interest by citizens of this place. An attempt will be made to find the parent ledge from which the boulders were broken."

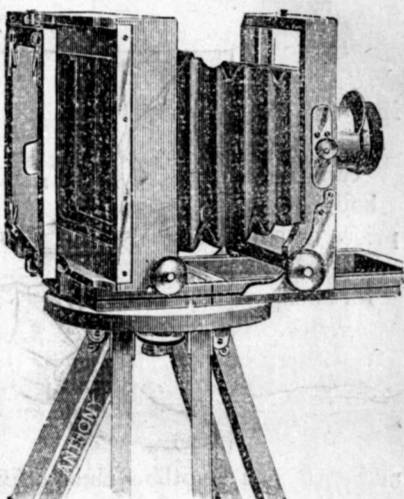
