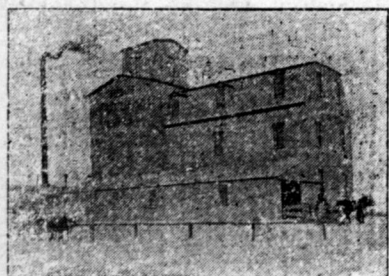

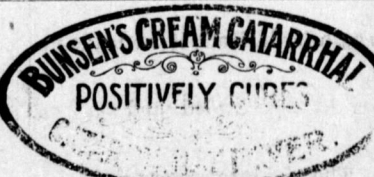

EDITOR THE THIRTEEN TOWNS:

I wish to say that our societies paid to the widows and orphans in just one year, \$38,810,118, which blessed many a home in the time of need.

I am proud to say that I am a member of two fraternal orders and represent the Maccabees while in your state, an order that any man can feel proud to be a member of. The total disability and old age clause of our insurance are well worth a man's consideration. We have now over 400,000 members and run on the graded premium plan with \$740,000 surplus and it is safely invested in United States bonds to this immense surplus. The order is adding to its surplus over \$5000 a month after paying all death losses and totally disabled members. An average of 25 disability claims paid every month. The premiums never vary in amount.

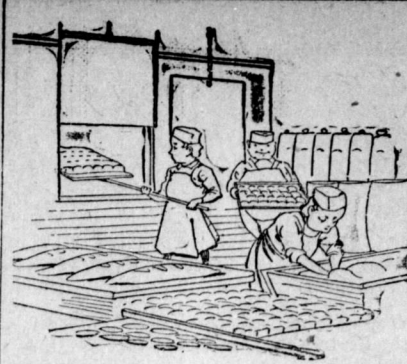
