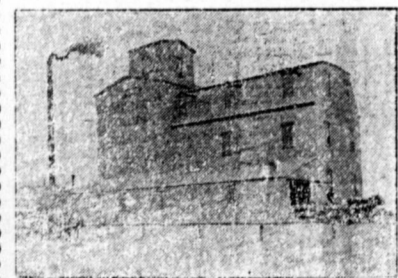
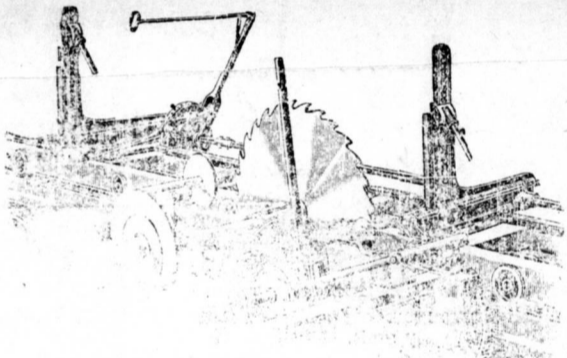

G. O. Stensrud was in town Tuesday taking orders.

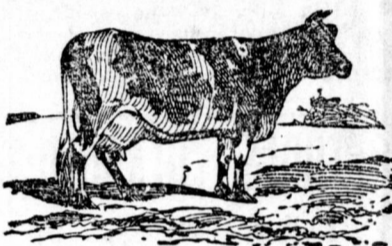
Hans Sovick is at home this week visiting the old folks.

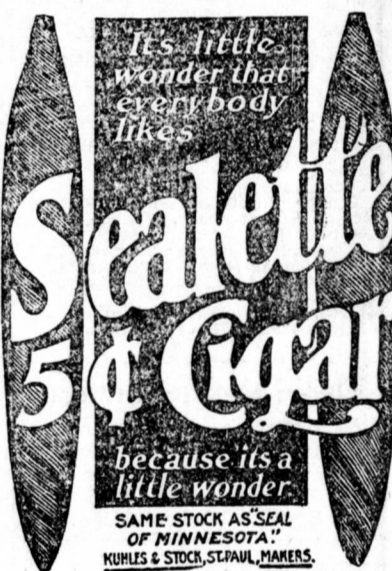

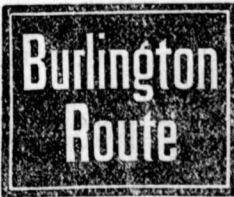
