OUR SOLDIERS LOOK ALIKE.

Fair-Haired Saxon Type Prevails in the Army.

The Saxon type prevails throughout our active fighting forces; at least, it so appears to the mere eye-observer, whatever the records may show. A newspaper correspondent, now in Boston, called my attention to this at San Fernando, in the interior of Luzon, and I had myself noticed and spoken of it. Everywhere the pale blue or gray eye, everywhere the fair skin, everywhere the tawny hair and beard. In Cebu, Panay, Negros, and Sulu the same phenomenon, writes Senator Beveridge. In many instances the beards have been allowed to grow, and observations were startlingly struck with the resemblance which these fierce-looking bearded men—boys in years—bore to the old pictures in our primary school histories of twenty-five years ago, and of the descriptions which accompanied them. The Saxon type is as conspicuous in the Philippines as the flag itself. Of course, the dark hair and eye are there, too. Three of the most daring and enduring soldiers I met were of that type, but the general impression is distinctly fairness in hair and lightness in eye. This calls to mind the homogeneity of the people of the republic. One might well expect the same type in the men from the Dakotas, Nebraska and Kansas; but he who has not followed ethnological currents in America would have expected that the southern troops would have been quite a different type. And yet, in the Tennessee troops in Hiloilo was found precisely the same type as in the Dakota troops at San Fernando. You might have said that they all came from the same section, the same state, the same county, almost the same family. It was an inspiring thought; the American people are indeed one people. The boys from Tennessee look like the brothers of the boys from Nebraska or Montana. The boys from Oregon and Washington look like the brothers of the boys from Pennsylvania. The boys from California look like the brothers of the boys from Minnesota. And brothers they are—brothers of the blood, brothers of the flag, brothers of battle, brothers of destiny. How mad must be the man who dares believe that by any temporary emergency these brothers can ever be divided against themselves.—Saturday Evening Post.

TO PROTECT STRANGERS.

Paris Has Increased Her Police Force.

Like vultures hovering over opposing armies in battle, the cleverest and most dangerous thugs and confidence men of the whole world are present in force at the French capital from the beginning to the end of the exposition.

So extensive were the depredations of the criminal classes during the last exposition that the minister of commerce declared the material advantages accruing to Paris from the great show were more than counterbalanced by the bad name given to the city by the horde of evildoers, both foreign and native, who preyed upon the unwary. Trade was benefited, but, owing to the ease with which criminals enriched themselves, the wrongdoers of Paris were confirmed in their ways and their numbers were increased to an extraordinary degree. In the opinion of the minister, the net result was a moral retrogression, the effect of which was by no means confined to France, and which cast a slur upon its fair name. It has been determined that the exposition of 1900 shall incur this reproach, and M. Lepine, the Paris prefect of police, has been hard at work for months organizing special measures for the protection of the lives, the property and the peace of the strangers whom the exposition will attract. He has entered into relations with the police authorities of the principal cities of the world in order to secure their co-operation, and he now declares himself quite ready to cope with all the clever villainy which is swooping down upon the city.

Patti Songs for Soldiers.

The recent war concert in London under the auspices of Lady Lansdowne realized the enormous sum of \$55,000. Of course, Patti was the principal attraction, and the London papers vie with each other in declaring that she looked younger than ever in a beautiful pale blue silk gown covered with diamonds, emeralds and turquoises. Mme. Patti was accompanied during her songs by Mr. Frank Watkis, who has been in constant attendance upon the great singer throughout all her tours since 1893. His touch is productive of a constant ripple of extraordinary lightness and delicacy. The piano talks to itself, as it were, yet never leaves the voice unaccompanied. Such a voice as Mme. Patti's needs a most sensitive accompanist—one who can follow the varying emotions of the great singer throughout all her moods and expressive cadenzas, and Mr. Watkis has succeeded wonderfully in pleasing her.
