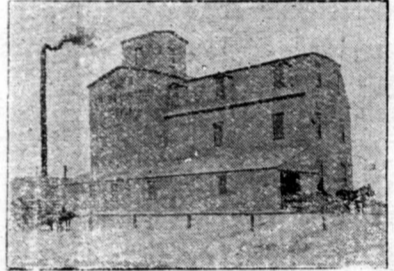

The ashmen have a regular schedule, \$1 a month for private houses, \$2 for apartment houses and so on up the scale.

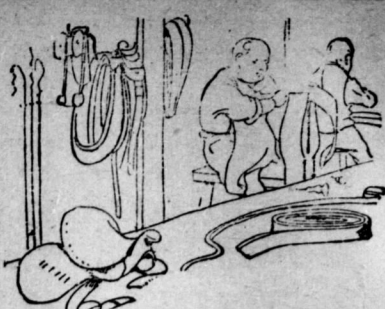
