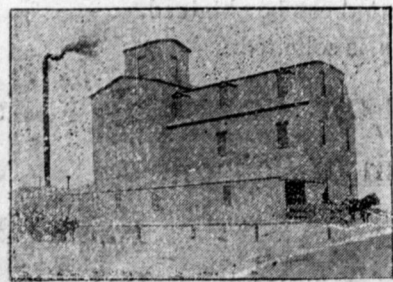

W. L. Hilliard left today for a trip to Thief River Falls and the Black Duck country.

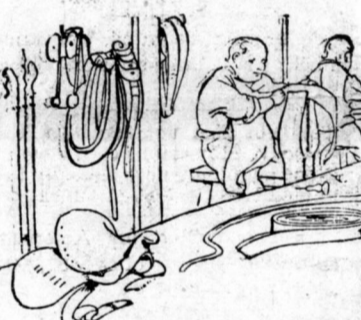
Rev. O. Taffin, of McIntosh, will preach at the school house, Sunday, at 11 o'clock. Good music and singing.

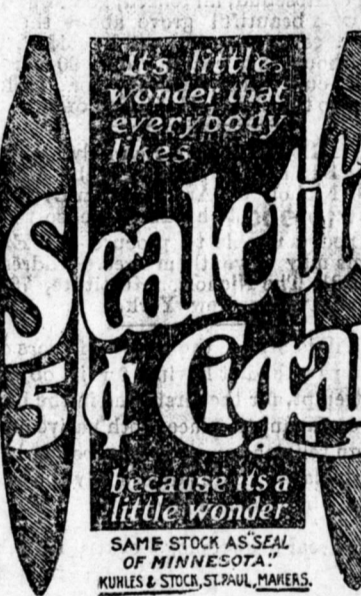
