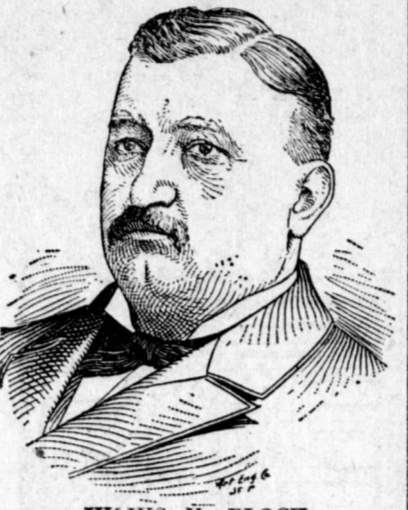

REPUBLICAN PLATFORM.
 The candidates on the Republican state ticket go before the voters of Minnesota on a platform of unquestioned strength and point with pride to a record of 40 years of control of public affairs in this state.

Minnesota on a platform of unquestioned strength and point with pride to a record of 40 years of control of public affairs in this state.

The principles adopted by the Republican national convention at Philadelphia are endorsed and the administration of President McKinley heartily approved. That the promises of the party made in 1896 have been carried out is proven by the high state of prosperity enjoyed by all as compared with the business stagnation existing when the present administration secured the reins of power.

The adoption of the gold standard law is approved and the sound financial policy of the party is credited with having contributed largely to the present prosperity.

The bravery and patriotism of our soldiers and sailors in the war with Spain is commended and a fair and liberal administration of the pension laws in behalf of the widows and orphans of those who fell in that war is favored.

The platform declares an unalterable opposition to all trusts and combinations having for their purpose the stifling of competition arbitrarily controlling production and fixing prices, and condemns the Democrats for the defeat of the constitutional amendment for regulation of the trust evil during the last session of congress.

Liberal legislation for the national defense and for the upbuilding of our navy is favored; also the proposed subsidy bill for the aid of our merchant marine and the enlargement of our foreign markets.

The record of the Republican party as the friend and champion of labor is referred to and a pledge made to use all legitimate means to secure the passage of legislation making eight hours the legal working day on all public works.

Coming down to state affairs the platform expresses confidence in Senator Knute Nelson and recommends his re-election by the incoming legislature.

The speedy passage of legislation now pending in congress to prevent the sale of oleomargarine is favored and the senators and representatives from this state are called upon to aid by

 On the question of railroad and corporation taxation the platform says:
 "The Republican party stands for the principle of fair and equal taxation and insists that every business, whether owned by corporations or individuals, should bear its just share of the public burden. We heartily approve of the legislation enacted by the last Republican legislature known as the "Somerville law," imposing a tax upon all foreign corporations doing business within this state.

"We heartily commend the present gross earnings system of taxation as to railroads. We believe that system to be attended with less friction and expense and to have produced better financial results than the method of direct taxation which prevails in some adjacent states. We are in favor of continuing the maintenance of this system in this state and we insist that the rate of taxation under the gross earnings system shall be maintained at such a figure as will make the tax annually collected on railroad property equal and uniform with the taxes imposed upon other property throughout the state."

At the meeting of the candidates on the Republican state ticket, the members of the state central committee were appointed by Chairman Young of the nominating convention. W. C. Masterman of Stillwater, formerly state senator from Washington county, was appointed chairman and C. C. Whitney of Marshall secretary. The following constitute the executive committee: Tams Bixby, chairman; Robert Jamison, C. A. Morey, E. S. Warner, A. F. Ferris, O. H. Myron and C. C. Whitney.
