Some Up-to-Date Hints About Cultivation of the Soil and Yields Thereof—Horticulture, Viticulture and Floriculture.

Improving the Farm's Fertility.

Charles A. Mooers, chemist of the Tennessee Agricultural College, says: The average Tennessee farmer should not hope permanently to increase or even to maintain the fertility of his land by means of commercial fertilizers alone.

The following considerations make this subject plain: The chemical analyses of our soils show that if we consider the total amounts of plant food they contain, the nitrogen supply would be consumed first, next would be phosphoric acid, and last of all potash.

The problem of improving our soils most profitably will be solved in most instances by the judicious use of mineral fertilizers, accompanied by stable manure and the growing of cowpeas, clover, or the like.

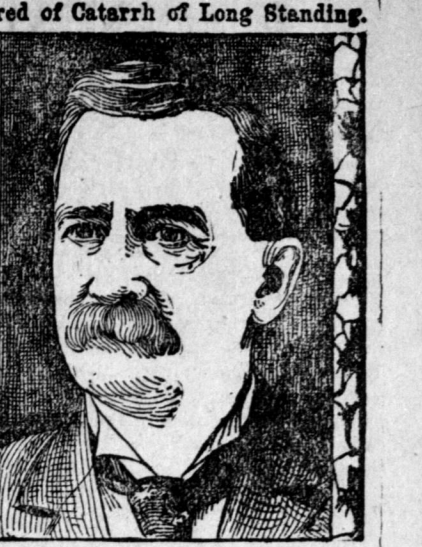
