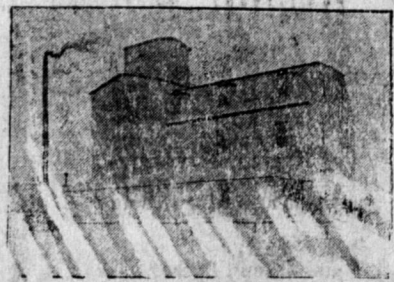

Miss Cora Hilliard has been visiting friends in Fosston this week.

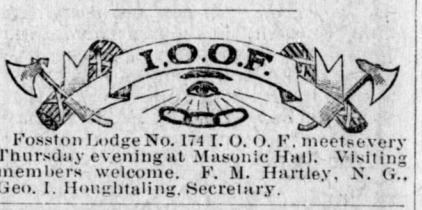
"Without any original thought of complete or even partial acquisition, the presence and success of our arms in Manila imposes upon us obligations which we cannot disregard. The march of events rules and overrules human action. Avowing unreservedly the purpose which has animated all our effort, and still solicitous to adhere to it, we cannot be unmindful that without any desire or design on our part the war has brought us new duties and responsibilities, which we must meet and discharge as becomes a great nation on whose growth and career from the beginning the Ruler of Nations has plainly written the high command and pledge of civilization."

Instead of diminishing, as was predicted four years ago, the volume of our currency is greater per capita than it has ever been. It was \$21.10 in 1896. It had increased to \$26.50 on July 1, 1900, and \$26.85 on Sept. 1, 1900. Our total money on July 1, 1896, was \$1,506,434,966; on July 1, 1900, it was \$2,062,525,496, and \$2,096,683,042 on Sept. 1, 1900.—William McKinley's Acceptance Speech.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the provisions of section five of the Act of Congress, approved January 14, 1889 (25 Stat., 642), as amended by the Act of Congress, approved February 28, 1891 (21 Stat., 17), that the survey, examination and appraisal of the lands in the four ceded townships in the White Earth Reservation, Tps. 13, 14, 15 and 16 N., R. 37 W., in the State of Minnesota, and a re-examination of certain tracts in the Red Lake Reservation, and by the Chippewa Indians, under the provisions of the Act of January 14, 1889, have been made, and that such of said lands as have been classed as "pine lands" within the meaning of the Statute will be offered for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash at the Crookston, Minn. land office, commencing at 9 A. 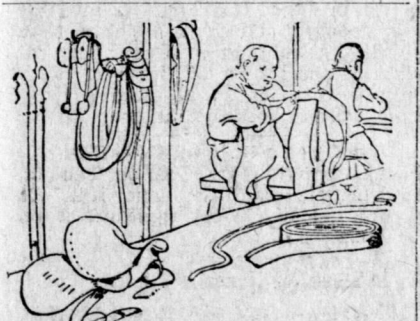

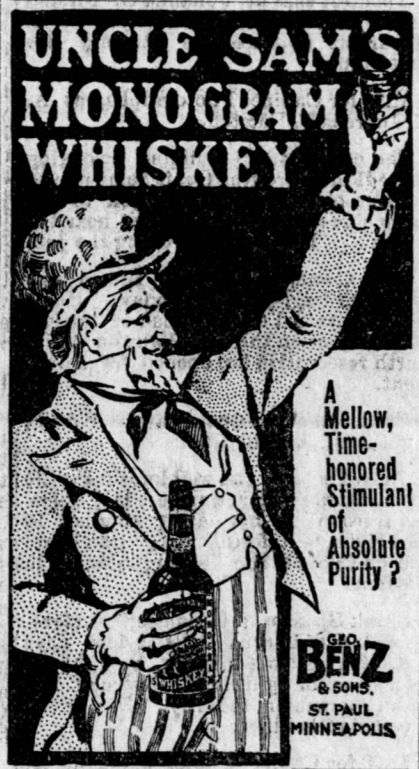
