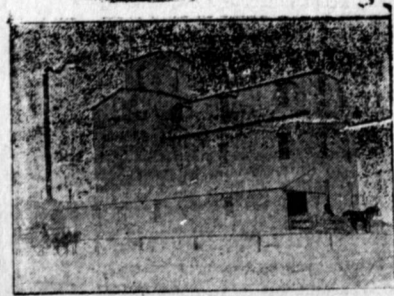

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

FOSSTON WOOLEN MILL.

The name of this corporation shall be FOSSTON WOOLEN MILL.

ARTICLE II.
The general nature of the business of this Corporation shall be, and its functions are limited to the manufacturing of wool into cloth, yarn and other articles, the making of clothing and such other goods and wares as are usually manufactured in a Woolen Mill, and the sale thereof, and incidentally to own and control, under lease or otherwise, buildings, lands, plants, franchises and other property necessary to all such manufacture and sale.

Also to own and hold such other lands, tenements and hereditaments as shall be taken in payment of, or as security for, debts due to such Corporation, and to manage and dispose of the same at pleasure.

ARTICLE III.
The principal place of the transaction of the business of this Corporation shall be the Village of Fosston, in the County of Polk, State of Minnesota.

ARTICLE IV.
The time for commencement of this Corporation shall be the 1st day of January 1901, and the period of its continuance shall be thirty years.

ARTICLE V.
The amount of the capital stock of the Corporation shall be Fifty thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars, to be divided into one thousand (1000) shares of the par value of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars each, to be paid in such manner and at such times and in such amounts as the board of directors may determine.

ARTICLE VI.
The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this Corporation shall at any time be subject, shall be the sum of Fifty thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars.
