Dale Hoover, Maintenance Department Rice County District Hospital

Maintenance employee enjoys his work

It's just about time for Dale Hoover to clock out when he gets a request to replace a ceiling light for a resident at Noble Place Independent Living. He grabs a bulb and the stepladder and heads for the residential complex.

Hoover works for the Rice County District Hospital's maintenance staff. He came to the hospital in May 1976 when Noble Place to its north and the Bolton Activity Center and parking lots to the south were both empty lots.

He came with experience, seventeen years at American Salt, working his way up from the loading dock to maintenance and later as the head electrician of their electrical department.

"I know all about boilers and electrical systems," Hoover said. "I'm capable of rebuilding and repairing just about any piece of equipment. That's one of the reasons the hospital hired me."

Back then, hospital maintenance was more about housekeeping, cleaning and painting, Hoover said. Most repair work took place in the boiler room. Yard work was hired out. Hoover worked with L.A. Wallace, maintenance manager and later took his position, hiring Dick O'Hannolin and John Payne as full-time employees.

Location of the maintenance shop shifted over the years, due to construction and remodels; from the basement of the current boiler room, across the hall from where the air conditioning system is located today, to a free-standing building they share with laundry northwest of the hospital.

The hospital didn't have computers under Hoover's watch. He recorded everything he did in large notebooks.

Hoover recently installed lights to the outdoor emergency signs, making them more visible to motorists.

"I love my job, the people I work with and the people I help," Hoover said. "Sometimes I get caught up in what I'm doing but welcome the challenges each day brings."

The work is stressful at times, but Hoover said he'll take it any way he can so he can continue to do what he loves and use the talents God has blessed him with.

Hoover has had the opportunity to travel to an orphanage in Haiti several times as a missionary for Haiti Love and Faith of Lyons.

"To see how the rest of the world lives and how very handicapped they are was an eye-opening experience," he said. "We are so blessed to live in the United States, especially in the center, where people are less affected by the world systems and have the freedom to move in the countryside and travel."

At age 77, he's still in good health.

"I'm going to keep going," he said, "doing what I love until they throw me out."



When he retired in 2000, everything went online.

He returned three months later as a part-time employee. Most of what he does day-to-day is routine; fixing things that need to be fixed, painting, maintenance at NP, cleaning up from construction and odd jobs assigned by his manager, Herman Hoffman.
