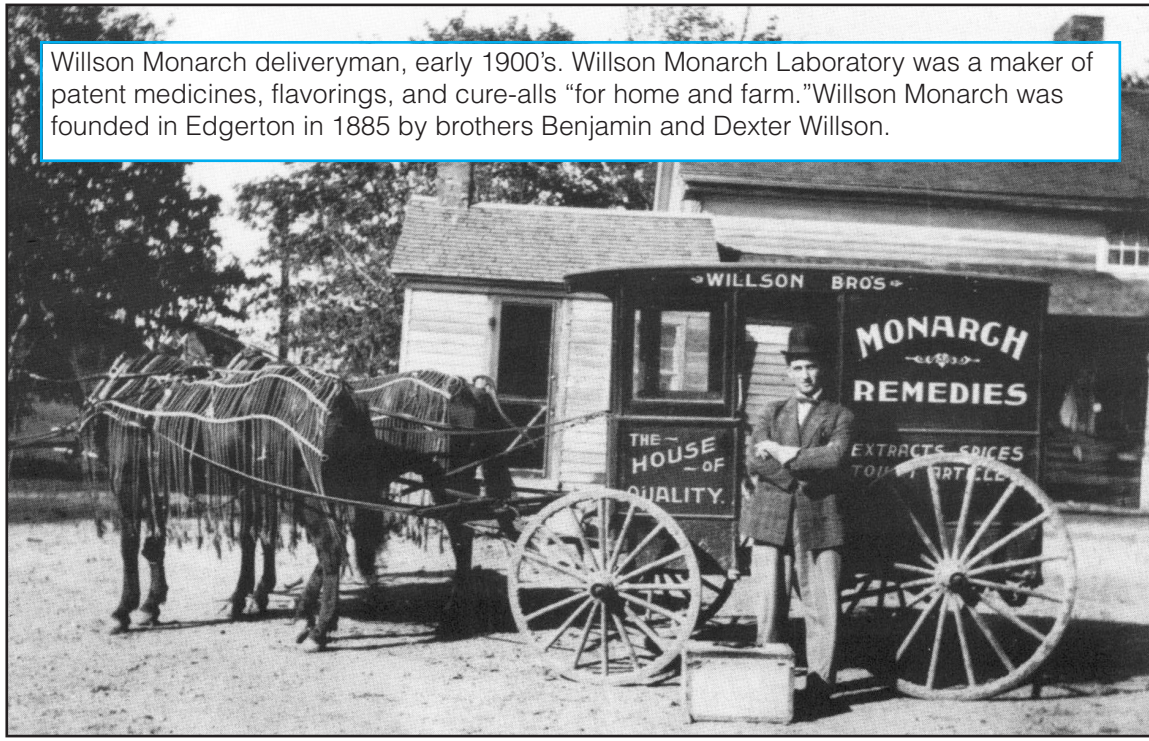
Wagons of tobacco being unloaded near the Fire Station (right) and the Wagon Shop once owned by Andrew Berry (center), around 1895.



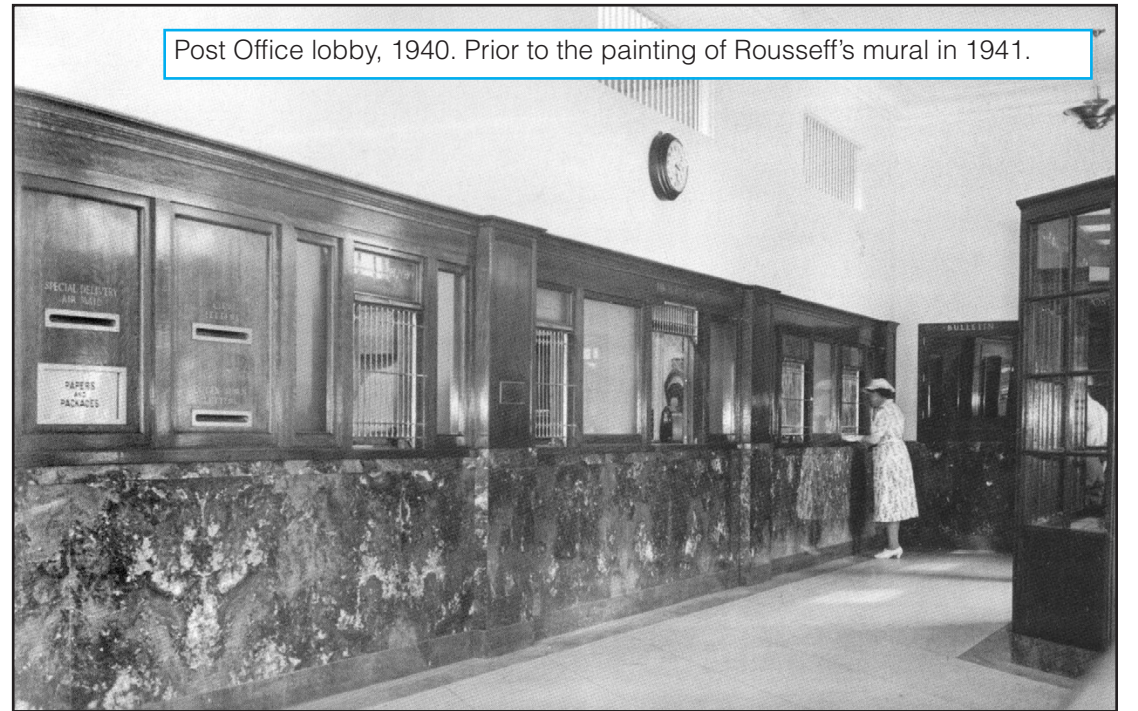

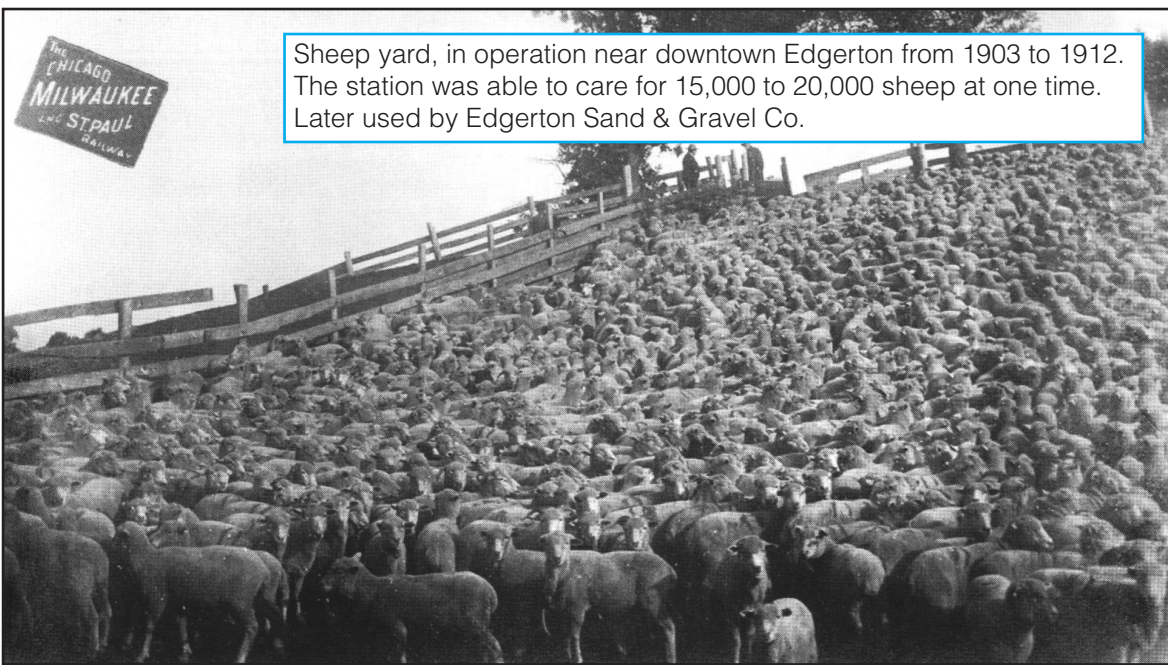

Post Office lobby, 1940. Prior to the painting of Rousseff's mural in 1941.



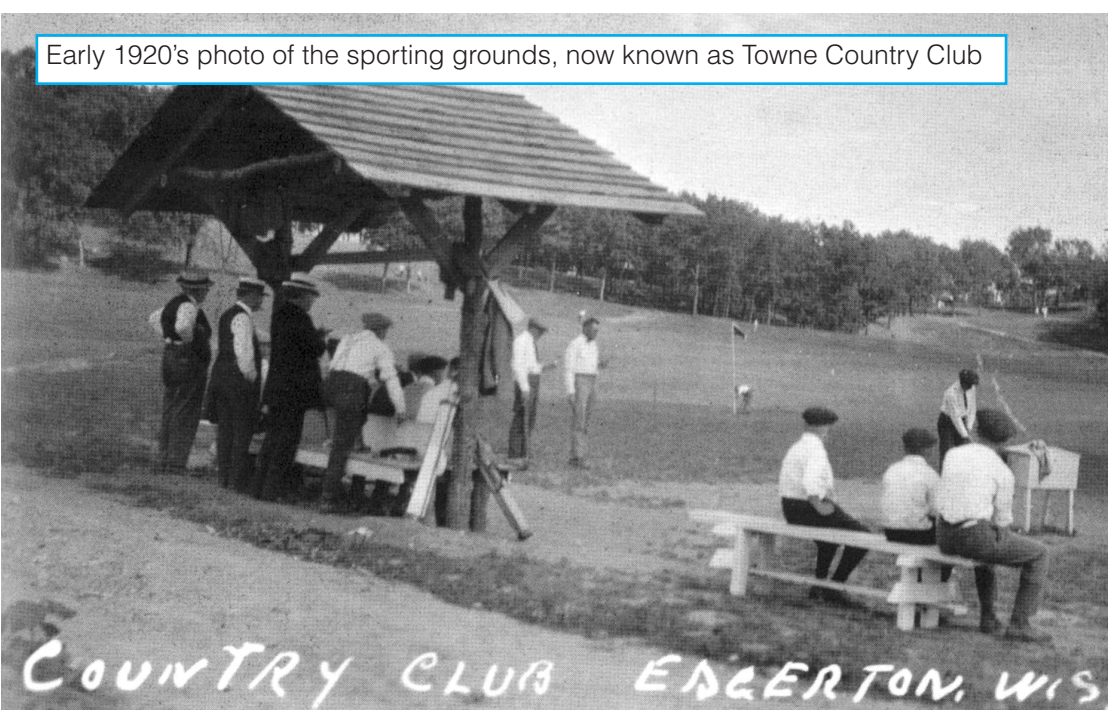
