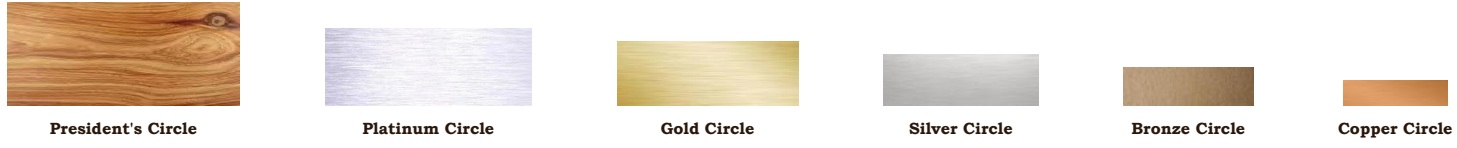


Complete the Dream... Continue the Vision



In 1950, Hoisington Lutheran Hospital committed itself to compassionate, quality patient care. In a continuation of that dedication, Clara Barton Hospital was born in 1990. In 2014, the communities served by Clara Barton Hospital and Clinics showed their appreciation by donating to the *Complete the Dream... Continue the Vision* capital campaign to build the Therapy Services and Laundry Facility expansion. Listed are the financial supporters of the project.

Foundation plans installation of donor recognition wall

Clara Barton Hospital has built the addition, has successfully engaged the community in a massive capital campaign, and is wrapping up said campaign, already raising over \$1,255,000 of a \$1.4 million goal. With only \$145,000 left to raise, the Foundation staff is looking to start laying the finishing touches.

One of those finishing touches is the donor recognition wall that is scheduled to be installed by the 25th Anniversary celebration on Friday, July 10.

"We are really excited to unveil the donor wall to our donors," reports Michelle Moshier, Executive Director of the Clara Barton Hospital Foundation. "It is truly humbling to see how this community came together to support the Foundation, and in turn, support the hospital."

The donor wall will be installed in the main hallway of the hospital, across from the existing recognition plaques from the original Hoisington Lutheran Hospital. "The placement is really important; it gives us a chance to recognize all of the driving forces that have gotten us where we are today," says Moshier. Any donor who gave

a gift or a pledge totaling over \$500 to the "Complete the Dream... Continue the Vision" capital campaign to fund the expansion will have a plaque on the donor wall, according to their level of gift: Copper Circle – \$500 to \$2,499; Bronze Circle – \$2,500 to \$4,999; Silver Circle – \$5,000 to \$24,999; Gold Circle – \$25,000 to \$49,999; Platinum Circle – \$50,000 to \$99,999; President's Circle – \$100,000 to \$249,999; and Founder's Circle – \$250,000 and above.

The plaques will correspond to the level of gift, i.e. Copper Circle donors will have a copper plate. The President's and Founder's Circle donors will have a special plaque, made from the red cypress tree that was cut down to build the addition.

Any donor that gave an amount up to \$499 will be recognized in the Friend's Journal, a bound book of donors and pictures of the construction and completed addition that will be printed when the campaign is complete.

Donors and community members are welcome to see the newly installed donor wall July 10, during the 25th Anniversary celebration.
