After 45 years as a first-responder for the community, Jim Sekavec moves to the front of the 119th annual Hoisington Labor Day Parade. Hoisington's Chamber of Commerce and Labor Day Committees an-

nounced Sekavec's selection as Grand Marshal on Tuesday, Aug. 25.

Sekavek announced his retirement after 25 years as chief and nearly 45 years of service in the Hoisington Fire Department in May.

He continues to serve on the Hoisington City Council and Hoisington

Land Bank Board, has been involved with Hoisington EMS and volunteers his time to provide public transportation to those of his community.

As his retirement was announced, Sekavec was recognized by his peers for his service since October 1970. Sekavec was one of the original nine charter

members of the Barton County Association of Fire Chiefs as he began his 25 years as chief of the Hoisington department.

Sekavec counts one of his most memorable experiences serving as commander-in-chief of the April 2001 tornado that destroyed 200 homes and injured 28 residents,

with one fatality


After the tornado, the accumulation of house, business and grass fires in the area "sort of runs together," Sekavec said.

While he still maintains his civic positions with the city, Sekavec plans to dedicate more time to his passion of restoring Caterpillar tractors. He currently has eight, with seven running. The eighth will take a little more work, he said.

He won't be traveling in a tractor come Labor Day Monday, though. Sekavec will be discharging his Grand Marshal duties from the back seat of his 1978 Camaro, with his daughter Alyssa Mc-Candless at the wheel.
