"Our defensive scheme wont change too much, but we are going to spread the offense out a little more and utilize a very good set of up and coming young playmakers, such as new quarterback Johnny Bizzell, along with receivers Jason Taylor, Aaron Hill and Jaedon Pool just to name a few," Rose said.

The Titans lost senior quarterback Braxton Dickerson last year, who was a mainstay in the Titans offensive scheme. But, Bizzell is looking to come in and take the job over and develop a backfield duo with Junior Diego Richards.

Rose spoke of the Titans schedule this year, saying it will be 'very tough'.

"We open up week one with Lawton and also have Ada and Ardmore back in the schedule for a few other non-district games," Rose said. "Then we have Guthrie week four for our first district game, and everyone knows how tough Carl Albert and Guthrie is. We also have to travel to both Guymon and Woodward."

With the loss of a couple of seniors, Rose said he has a few senior leaders to take over those roles.

"RT Sherman, Jake Hill, Johnny Bizzell, Braden Pursell, Branton Swanner and Antonio Singleton are a few of our senior leaders for this
