The next step is to wash and shear the sheep and then finally break them and get them ready to go out in the show ring.

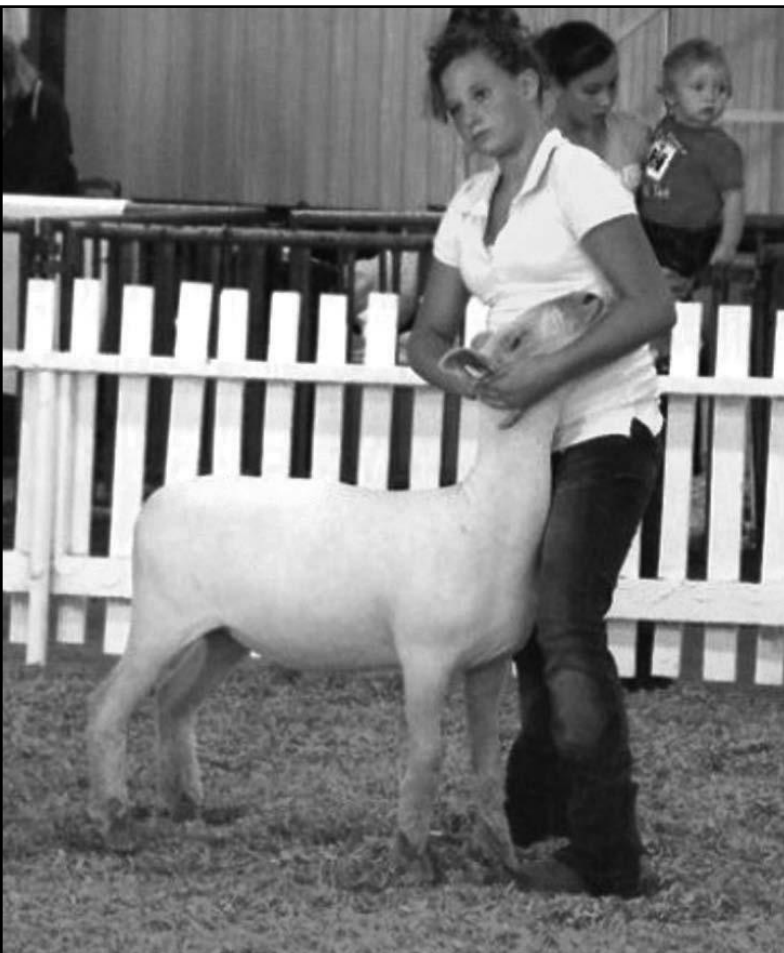

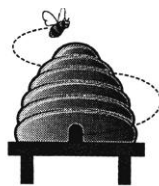
