Where there is a need-there are Lions. In times of disaster, fighting disease, building playgrounds and health facilities to providing eyeglasses and hearing aids the Lions meet the challenge. Melvin Jones, a Chicago businessman, saw the need to organize business leaders to give back to their communities. In 1917, he spearheaded the formation of Lions Clubs. In 1925 Helen Keller, who became blind and deaf as a child, spoke at the International Lions Convention. She charged Lions to become "Knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness." Since that time Lions have adopted that mission to fight preventable blindness and assisting those that are blind. The organization has grown to 1.4+ million members in 46,000 clubs across the globe. It is the largest volunteer service organization in the world.

The Dixon Lions Club is proud to be a part of Lions International. The Club was chartered in 1944 and celebrated 75 years of service recently. Currently the Dixon Lions Club has 20 volunteer members and meets on the second and fourth Tuesdays at 6:00 in the Oak Hills Country Club's banquet room. The Club has members from age 18 years to 88 years.

- The Dixon Lions provide eyeglasses and hearing aids for those who cannot afford them as referred by school nurses and other professionals.
- The Dixon Lions have provided child and handicapped swings, see saws, slides, pavilions, picnic tables, barbeque grills and other equipment in the Dixon Lions Club Park.
- The Dixon Lions assisted in the purchase of the warning lights for the Dixon school district.
- The Dixon Lions, along with the Chamber of Commerce, purchased the Christmas street light decorations. Each year the Lions spend an evening repairing and replacing bulbs for those decorations.
- The Dixon Lions have sponsored a high school band student to attend the Missouri Lions All-State band.
- The Dixon Lions have awarded a scholarship (as funds have allowed) to a high school senior.
- The Dixon Lions help to provide Christmas treats and Thanksgiving baskets.
- The Dixon Lions have donated to various local individuals and organizations in need of equipment or assistance.

In addition to the local donations, the Dixon Lions donate to:

- Leader Dogs for the Blind which provides service dogs to the blind at no charge to the recipient.
- Lions Clubs International Foundation which provides funds for disaster relief, programs for youth, programs for immunizations and grants for playgrounds, health facilities and community centers.

- Sight First which is an eye bank and recycling center for eyeglasses and provides eye tests for children.
