

Lessard takes reins of young LHS spring net squad

After 10 seasons of fall tennis, Larned tennis coach Mark Lessard will be starting fresh in 2016.
Well, not exactly fresh. The Indians' girls' tennis guru spent three seasons as assistant to boys' coach Joe Snyder, who retired in 2015. It wasn't that big of a leap to the boys' top spot.
"It's not that big of a jump," said Lessard, whose coaching style is as big on using a racket as explaining how to use it. With four players out of 11 returning varsity court time, Lessard will be spending a good deal of time explaining in the early season.
"I've given the talk a number of times," said Lessard. "This is a tennis racket, this is how you hold it, this is a forehand grip, this is a backhand... it's basic tennis and that's where you always start."
In the fall, the girls' season starts with the hour-long road trip to the Dodge City junior varsity meet, with Lessard giving last-minute pointers as he drives. The girls have learned the drill; the first few weeks, it's mix-and-

match on the court, with Lessard at one end hitting volleys and serves and leading conditioning drills.
Once the wind dies down for a decent early-spring practice, the boys will be getting the same delivery.
"We are trying out an intra-squad round-robin tournament to see where everyone falls," Lessard said. "From that, I'll make the decision on who will compete in singles and doubles on varsity and junior varsity. I believe we will be very solid in singles and doubles at the varsity level."
Having the extra numbers means an opportunity to enter some junior varsity meets, and that means more experience later on for a varsity challenge.
Juniors David Thompson and DJ Mead and Cadin Lymon and Trevor Coulson return, respectively, as No. 1 and No. 2 doubles from last season.
The Indians open on the road at Hutchinson on Tuesday April 5.
After another road trip to Cimarron, they have their home debut on Tuesday, April 12. The Central Kansas League meet is May 2 in Pratt, followed by Class 3A regional May 7.
