community are not down hearted. They are looking forward ---not backward."

This heartening testimony from this past generation proves a proud heritage that we still see strong in Hoisington today. This city has seen its fair share of disaster; two tornados, the great Depression, the dust bowl, the loss of the railroad and fires and economic slowdown which have shaped us into the community we are today. The landscape may look different, but our backbone and attitude stay the same. New and safer streets, a progressive and state-of-the-art hospital and school district, new housing, new retail businesses, an active Chamber and a City that listens are only a few of the things we can look at today and be proud of who we are.






