## Cardinal cagers counting on collective contributions in 2016-2017

By MIKE GILMORE The Hoisington Cardinals head into the 2016-17 cage season missing a driving force, but are banking on a collective effort.

Graduated senior Steffan Dolechek led last year's Cardinals averaging 16.0 points per game. The all-Central Kansas League first-team guard also paced the Cards on the floor with 6.2 rebounds and three assists per contest.

Last year, the Cardinals got off to a slow start but then won seven of their last nine games, including their seasonending 81-56 loss to Beloit in the first round of their Class 3A sub-state.

The Cardinals finished with an 8-13 record in 2016, but the wins did include a 39-38 championship victory over the Minneapolis Lions in the Hoisington Activity Center. Dolechek led the team with 10 points,

but it was two clutch free throws from senior Corbin Crawford that sealed the deal on Hoisington's first Winter Jam Tournament title since

Graduation notwithstanding, the Cards are back in building mode. The current Cardinal lineup is being structured around four seniors that started in over 18 games last year, led by 6-2 senior guard/ forward Cameron Davis. Davis returns 7.0 ppg., 7.0 rpg., 2 assists and 1.5 steals per game that the rest of the squad can build around.

"We will definitely miss Steffan Dolechek's presence on the court as a scorer and distributor, but we do have the potential to be stronger on both sides of the court this year if we focus on playing as one unit," noted eight-year head boys' coach Kyle Haxton.

Also in the mix is 6-1 senior guard Brenner Donovan (5.5 ppg., 2/0 rpg.); 6-0 senior Grant Dolechek (4.0 ppg., 4.0 rpg) and 5-11 senior guard Tyler Specht (3.5 ppg., 2.0 rpg). Senior Kyle Lang, a 6-2 guard, adds 2.5 ppg. And 1.5

rpg.
"This group will pose many different threats with Tyler, Cameron and Brenner's ability to get to the basket; Grant and Cameron's ability to do the dirty work around the basket and Brenner, Kyle and Tanner's ability to shoot from the perimeter.

"Our athleticism and desire to compete will play a huge factor into how solid we are on the defensive end."

Haxton noted that the senior-dominated lineup could present a strong leadership model for the rest of the players coming up.

"If our seniors, along

with some of our young players making strides, work together and use their athleticism, then it could be a very successful year for us. We have a junior in Isaac Prosser and two sophomores, Xavier Robinson and Braxton Donovan, that got some experience at the varsity level a year ago. We also have freshman point guard Alex Schremmer that had a great summer and will be expected to step in and play an important role on this team."

The Cardinals face their first test at home in the HAC in their seasonopener tonight against a Class 2A state defending, but rebuilding, Central Plains squad. The next test comes next week in Larned, as Hoisington squares off against an alsorebuilding Larned team in the first round of the Keady Classic; St. John, Spearville and a hungry


