history last year, ending St. John's record winstreak and taking a perfect record into the state tournament. After a loss in the semifinals, the Oilers pounded Hill City in the consolation game to finish the season at 25-1. The Oilers are 66-9 over the past three years.

But the losses this winter will be significant. Michael Ryan was Rolfs' floor general, averaging 17.5 ppg and earning a plethora of post-season honors. As a four-year starter, Ryan set the school record for career steals, and is second on the list in scoring and assists.

Braedan Crites was another four-year starter. Last year he averaged

8.4 points, 6.3 rebounds, and 5.2 assists a game. Jacob Warnken averaged 9.5 points a night, and Brady Rugan finished at five points a game. Last year's seniors accounted for two-thirds of the Oiler offense.

Rolfs will still have some big weapons back in 6-foot-3 junior Alex Barton, and 5-foot-11 sophomore Devin Ryan. Both are returning starters. Barton injured his hand in the final game of the football season and will miss the first portion of the season. He averaged eight points and four rebounds a game last season.

"Alex will be expected to step up big on both ends of the court

this season," Rolfs said. "He brings great athleticism and has the unique ability to play both inside and out. He continues to improve his game on both sides, and will no doubt be the difference maker on many nights. We look for him to play a big role for us and will be a key to our success.'

As a freshman last year, Ryan was a big part of some late game situations. He averaged 8.5 points and 2.5 rebounds a game.

"Devin really stepped up for us last season and played extremely well for his age," said Rolfs. "That experience will serve him well as he enters his sophomore year. I expect him to lead


