Year of First Hunts

For seven year-old Ethan Hemsath, 2016 was a year of first hunts.

Ethan bagged his first whitetail deer on his first ever deer hunt on the XTC Ranch in Mills County on a Saturday morning. The XTC Ranch is a member of the Texas Parks & Wildlife Managed Land Deer Permit system, which allows rifle hunting during the regular archery season. So, Ethan was able to harvest his doe with a .243 rifle at around 50 yards. Ethan made a perfect shot and the doe did not go far before expiring.

Grandfather Robb Hemsath also harvested a doe on the same morning hunt, making for a great double Mills County hunting memory.

NOTE: Harvesting does early in the season is one way the XTC Ranch manages its deer herd in accordance with guidelines from Texas Parks & Wildlife.

Earlier last fall, Ethan (pictured above) went on his first dove hunt with his dad and grandfather near Brownwood. On his first dove hunt, Ethan bagged two doves with his .410 shotgun. It was another great hunting memory for the three generations of Hemsath men.

Ethan also bagged a squirrel all by himself with his pellet gun last fall. As you can see from the photos, Ethan enjoyed his year of first hunts.

Ethan is the son of Matthew and Suzanne Hemsath of Burlington and the grandson of Robb and Monica Hemsath of Goldthwaite.
