Kyle caught sight of the buck chasing a doe into the oat field he was hunting over. He dropped the 16 point monster in his tracks at around 100 yards with his .204 rifle.

Trashman is a true low fence Mills County trophy whitetail. Kyle’s dad Danny has sheds from
