"Coach Dungan is one of the best football coaches I have ever been around and we are blessed to have him as part of our program," King said. "He has taught me a lot and he is going to have a great impact on the young men on this team." Aycock joins the program

And, he also served as the head coach at Purvis Junior High School, experience King believes in an important part of his resume.

is lucky to have them on board. Prentiss coaches the receivers and H-backs, while Hollinghead is responsible for the defensive linemen. Moore coaches the defensive backs. Wyatt is a volunteer assistant and helps wherever needed. Coach King works directly with the quarterback and running back group.

At the high school, coaches are also teachers, and members of Wildcat coaching staff are expected to pull their weight in the classroom. That is not a problem at GCHS, according to administrators.
