

Sophomore Jaheim Cooper is also expected to see a good bit of playing time this year. Cooper impressed coaches with his attendance and work ethic this summer and can play either the middle or strong-side spots for the Cats. Like McDonald, Cooper will see time along the defensive front and in the linebacking corps. Junior Santez Campbell will provide depth at linebacker and see also playing time for Aycock.

The defensive front has also been solid for the Wildcats and is one of the deeper position groups on the team. Anchoring the line are returnlettermen Blake ing Daughdrill and Garrett Hicks. At 6-3, 280 pounds, Daughdrill has the size and strength to be a dominating force on the inside for GCHS. He still has work to do with technique, but as a junior with a full season of varsity play already under his belt, Daughdrill seems primed to

have a big season for the Wildcats. He had 7.5 tackles in the opener and stepped up against George County with another dominating performance that included five tackles. Down the line at defensive end is Hicks, the only senior among the regulars in the group. Hicks has a nice combination of size and athleticism to his credit as well and has been solid as a run defender and pass rusher so far.

Sophomore Hunter McLeod and junior Drake Walley have been productive too, combining for 12.5 tackles through two games. Sophomore Josh Bolton, along with Byrd and Cooper, round out the deep defensive line.

One of the big question marks coming into the season, according to Aycock, was whether the defensive backs could tackle in space and also come up for run support. Through the first two weeks the answer has been 'yes'.

Senior Tagg Creech can also play multiple positions on defense and will be called upon regularly for support. Coaches hope his interception late in the game to seal the win over George County is the first of many big plays for Creech this season.
