Little said Hey Day Entertainment has been recognized by its industry as one of the top entertainment centers in the country.

"We are a classical theater focusing mainly on Shakespeare, but we also do other classics," said Michael Gibbons, managing director of Oklahoma Shakespeare in the Park. "The company was in Edmond for over 20 years before moving to Oklahoma City about 15 years ago."

Gibbons said they perform two shows each summer at the Paseo because it offers air conditioning and several shows at the Myriad Botanical Gardens.

"As much as we love to be outdoors, trying to do Shakespeare at the Myriad Gardens in July and August is just painful for the audience and the actors as well," he said.

Ticket prices for the Myriad shows are \$20 for adults and \$15 for students, seniors and military personnel.

Indoor shows at the Paseo are \$25 for adults and \$20 for students, seniors and military personnel.
