a baseball scholarship offer.

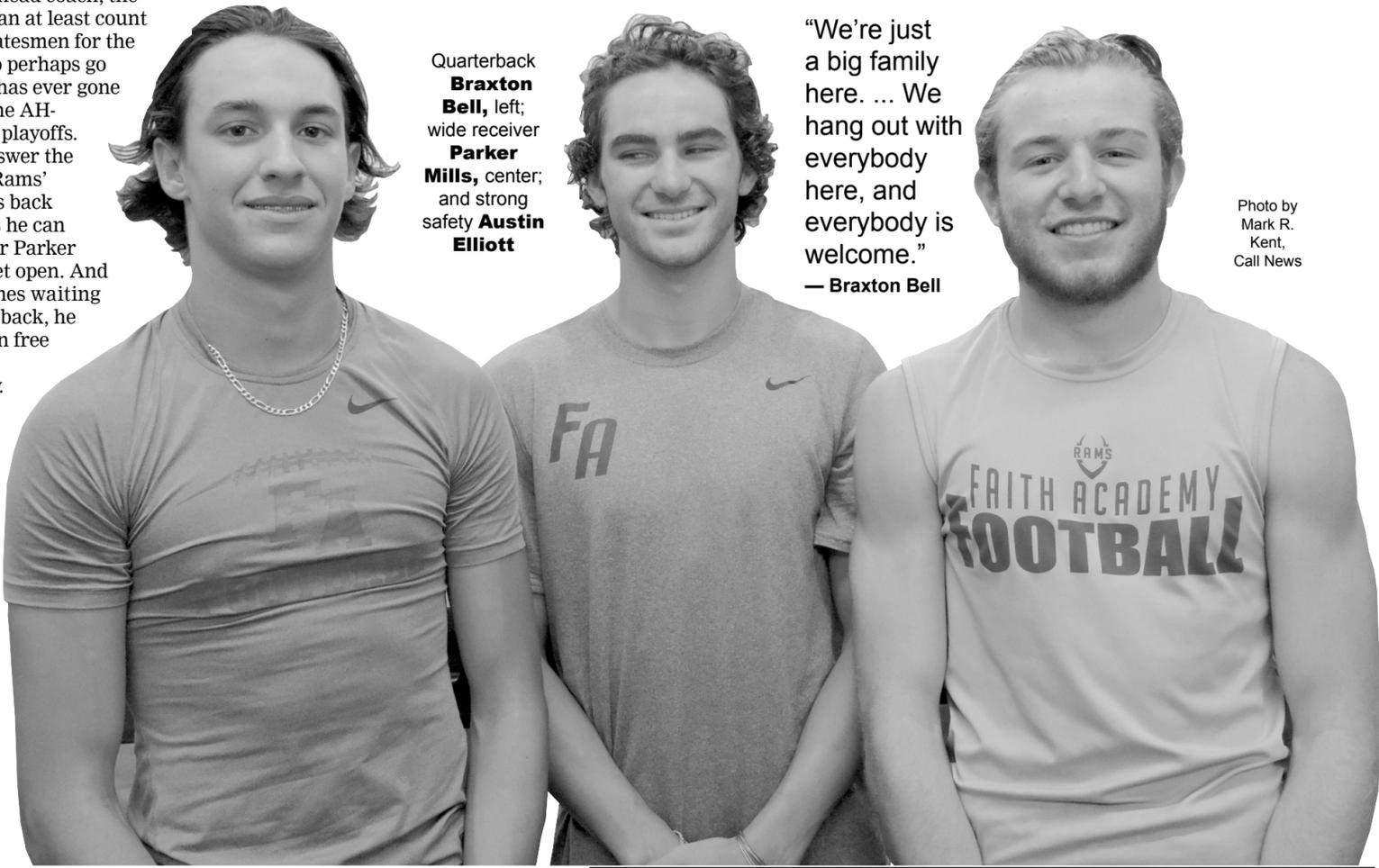
Mills is still working on his college plans, but rest assured, he says he is going to be in a classroom somewhere, taking courses this time a year from now.
