Crawford heads to state in VFW contest

Alissa Crawford, a senior at Alexander Central High School, was named the 2016-17 "Voice of Democracy" first-place winner by Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 5466 of Taylorsville, receiving a \$50 prize. After winning the local competition, Crawford went on to win the VFW Western District, competing against students from Iredell, Catawba, Lincoln, Cleveland, and Burke counties. She will go to Raleigh in February to compete in

the state-level contest for a chance to win a \$30,000 college scholarship.

Crawford is the daughter of Ashley and Lisa Crawford of the Bethlehem Community. The student hopes to study nursing at Lenoir-Rhyne University.

Dawson, Killian among honorees at Board of Education meeting Feb. 7

Alexander County Board of Education members recognized several educators at the regular meeting held on Tuesday, February 7.

Three educators were recognized Tuesday. These included Amy Dawson, Digital Learning & Innovation Specialist for Alexander County Schools, who completed Google for Education Certification; Taylorsville Elementary teacher Michelle Robinson, Digital Badge Winner; and West Alexander Middle School teacher/coach Brian Killian, who was a grant recipient from the American Heart Assoc. & U.S. Games.

Dr. Bill Griffin recognized Communities in Schools representative Angie Yates and Student Success Center Director Angela Charles, who have worked with Griffin and others on a proposed drug intervention class, "Thinking For A Change." This 8-lesson, hour-long class will be administered daily for two weeks at the Success Center during Smart Lunch to students who have controlled substance violations.

Hefner mentioned that the sewer project at the ACHS Baseball Field is done. Minor touch-up work will be done using help from the ACHS Trades classes before the season begins.

The Superintendent noted that Alexander staff presented at multiple State Board of Education events recently and represented the system quite well.

The Board approved a right-of-way agreement for Landis Lane at the West Alexander Middle School property, as requested by adjacent landowners.

Teresa Smeeks, Director of AIG,

Advanced Programs, and Accountability, presented the proposed sixth draft of the 2017-18 school calendar, which was then approved by the Board.

The Board voted to send a resolution to the General Assembly asking for lenience in K-3 class size and suitable funding. ★



Alex water tap fees discounted through June 30

If your home or business is located on a road that is served by the City of Hickory/Alexander County water system, and you would like to connect to the water line, residents are being advised that the water tap fee will double on July 1, 2017. Water tap charges actually increased January 1, 2017, but due to an incentive, potential Alexander County water customers will pay the former rate through June 30, 2017.

The discounted water tap charges are: \$1,066 (3/4"

meter), \$1,980 (1" meter), \$4,229 (1.5" meter), \$5,190 (2" meter), \$17,430 (3" meter), \$21,814 (4" meter), \$33,940 (6" meter), and \$43,294 (8" meter). Once the incentive expires on July 1, total tap costs will be double these amounts. In addition, current Alexander County water customers have likely noticed a difference in their water bill as the rates have been unified for all customers. The new water rate contains a customer charge of \$8.74 and an availability charge of \$22.24, for a base bill total of



\$30.98. An additional \$3.02 is charged for every 1,000 gallons of water used.
