Calf scramble featured at fair

A Wyandot County Fair calf scramble, started in 2014, will be back again this year. Organizers say they were looking for a fun event that would involve fair teens and adults, and calf scrambles have been popular at other area fairs.

The scramble is open to anyone 15 years of age and above. The contest is set up like this: In each heat there are 10 people in the arena with three calves. The object is to catch and halter a calf correctly with no help from anyone else in the arena.

There is a different cash amount for each calf. The participants don't know the dollar amount until they have successfully haltered the calf. The first to accomplish this in each heat wins the cash. The plan is for five heats

involving 50 people.

A championship round will be held based on the lowest successful times recorded. There will be a separate cash prize for the winner

National Kiddie Tractor Pull

The National Kiddie Tractor Pull has become a yearly favorite at the Wyandot County Fair. This year's pull will be held Friday, Sept. 15, at 3 p.m. outside of the Masters Building.

The pull is a miniature tractor pull for boys and girls from the ages of three through eight years old. It is 1/10th scale size using pedal tractors and a scale size weight transfer sled. The pull lane is 30 feet in length and there are three age classes.

The kids pull the sled with a pedal tractor and as they proceed down the pull lane the box moves

forward, transferring the weight from the wheels to the pan, which makes it harder to pull. Weight is loaded into the box until there is a winner in each class. The first three children to win in each age class are invited to pull at the Grand National Tractor Pull.
