

exhibitor can enter or win in one year.

Fitting includes: 1. Soundness, condition and quality in case of beef animals, sheep and swine, firmness and uniformity. 2. Cleanliness, hide, hair, hoofs. 3. General appearance of animals.

Showing includes: 1. Appearance of exhibitor and equipment used to show animals. 2. Ability to properly pose animals. 3. Exhibitor must demonstrate ability to show his animal around the ring as directed by the judge.

**SHOWMAN OF SHOWMEN**

Showman of showmen is a competition between the representatives of the senior showmanship classes. All senior showmanship division winners in beef feeders, dairy, dairy feeders, dairy steers, goats, horses, market beef or beef breeding, poultry, rabbits, sheep and swine departments are eligible to compete. In order to add a livestock species to this list there must be a minimum of 10 exhibitors showing that species in one year. Additions and changes will be made the following year to the livestock list as long as 10 exhibitors are expected that year. The departments will determine how their senior age participant is selected. The show will take place Friday, Sept. 15, at 12 noon in the Junior Fair arena.

**LIVESTOCK SALE**

The Junior Fair livestock sale will take place Saturday, Sept. 16, at 9 a.m. Auctioneers include Matt Walter, Doug Walton, Jack Gottfried, Robert Abbott, Kent Weatherholtz, Paul Wagner and Chad Gottfried.

The purpose of the sale is to provide a marketing opportunity for small and large animals and animal products. All animals must have been exhibited in the Junior Fair show in order to be eligible to sell.

Exhibitors may sell one time only including the gallon of milk.

Junior Fair exhibitors planning to sell their animals or participate in the gallon of milk sale must complete a sale entry form within one-half hour after the show.

Sale order is poultry/eggs; steer; lambs; hogs; dairy feeders; beef feeders; goats; gallon of milk; rabbits.

**LIVESTOCK RELEASE TIMES**

Livestock in the Junior Fair will be released Sunday, Sept. 17. All animals will remain on the fairgrounds until their release time. Buyers have two hours after release time of that species to pick up animals or make arrangements with head of department. Release times are, swine, 6 p.m.; junior and open breeding stock, 7 p.m.; goats, 7 p.m.; rabbits and poultry, 7 p.m.; steers and lambs, 7 p.m.; dairy feeders and beef feeders, 7 p.m.

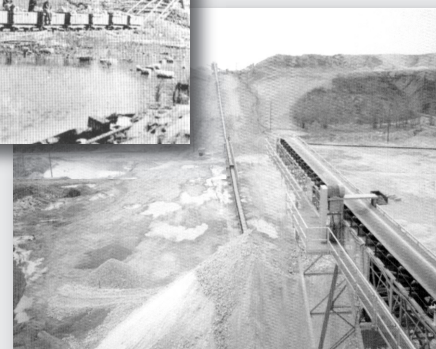
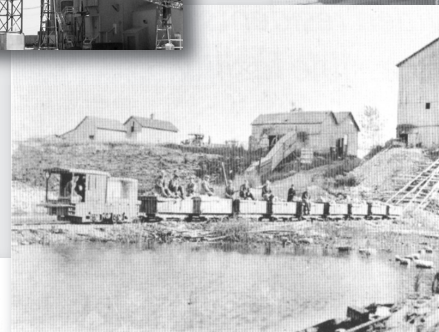
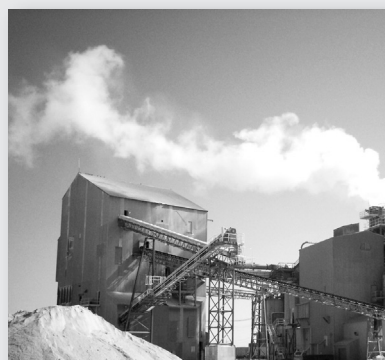
