Look for the Heroes "Mr. Kentucky" rescues victims of Hurricane Harvey

Mister Rogers once shared with his listeners the words his mother used to comfort him with at times when the

world seemed to be void of hope and filled with despair, "Look for the helpers. You will always find good people who are helping."

As the final days of August came, for Houston and surrounding

counties in Texas and into Louisiana, disaster loomed on the horizon. Hurricane Harvey made landfall as the strongest hurricane to hit the mainland United States in over a decade before being downgraded to

a tropical storm. That Friday 18 inches of rain poured down on the area, with strong warnings of the catastrophic downpour to come.

By Tuesday, August 29 Cedar Bayou, Texas, just east of Houston, would record 51.88 inches of rain. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric measured 19 locations in Houston and surrounding areas with more than 40 inches of rain, record breaking rainfall as the most ever recorded in the continental U.S. from a single rain event. For perspective, the Dallas Morning News tweeted, "rain from Harvey could fill all NFL, Division 1 college football
