A little less than what it is as it's become the have-to-have item to commemorate some special structure or event that is synonymous with Russell County, and this year they didn't disap-

So without further adieu, the winner is The Star Theater! As the description says on the back of the box of every ornament purchased:

"The Star Theater, originally called "the Russell" began construction in May, 1949. The building originally had a bowl-shaped floor and could seat 510. Owned and operated by AV Luttrell it opened its doors to movie goers February 23, 1950 at 6:00 PM. The feature that evening was "Mrs. Mike" starring Dick Powell and Evelyn Keys. The Star continued to entertain adults and kids for many years, closing the doors as a movie house in the 70's. During the years after it closed it was home to a variety of businesses until it was purchased by thee Russell County Arts Council. After a period of remodeling it opened its doors in July, 1994 as a theater for live performances. The Star continues today to entertain the families of Russell and surrounding counties." They are a limited edition and
