Murderer receives life for killing wife in front of kids

Staff Reports After a three-day trail, ending

Wednesday, May 3, a Holmes County Jury returned a verdict of guilty for Walter Blanden, Jr. of Lexington, according to a press release from the office of Holmes County District Attorney Akillie Malone-Oliver.

Blanden was charged for the April 2016 slaying of his wife, Remmell Blanden, also of Lexington.

Blanden was sentenced to serve life in prison for the killing which took place within their family home in front of her three children, said the release. According to Malone-Oliver,
