SBA deadline to apply for Physical Damage Disaster Loans is July 21

The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding eligible Private NonProfit (PNP) organizations in Mississippi of disaster loan applications for physical damages caused by severe storms, tornadoes, straightline winds and flooding on April 30, 2017.

PNPs located in Adams, Calhoun, Carroll, Claiborne, Holmes, Jefferson, Montgomery, Webster, and Yazoo counties in Mississippi are eligible to apply to SBA. Examples of eligible noncritical PNP organizations include, but are not limited to, food kitchens, homeless shelters, museums, libraries, community centers, schools and

Applicants may be eligible for a loan amount inthe July 21 deadline to submit crease up to 20 percent of their physical damages, as verified by the SBA for mitigation purposes. Eligible mitigation improvements may now include a safe room or storm shelter to help protect property and occupants from future damage caused by a similar disaster. Additionally, PNPs can obtain loans for unmet working capital needs. To be considered for this assistance, PNPs need to apply by the deadline.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure website at https://disaster-
