Special teams are expected to be a strong area for the Arrows this season, with junior place kicker Tucker Barefoot back after a stellar season in 2016. Walker Burchfield will once again handle the punting duties. Burchfield and QB Hunter Hulsey will share holding duties. CHS will have three deep snappers this season: Des Baker, Hunter Barnes and freshman Caleb Miller.

For the Arrows, the first four non-district games are very tough once again, to get the team ready for district play. It all starts with perennial state champion South Panola at home Thursday night, August 17. CHS will also play Vicksburg, Germantown, and their oldest rival, Brandon, in non-district

"We've got four practice games to get ready for district play," said Boswell. "We've got to get a lot of new faces experienced very fast. We are the toughest district in the state in Class 6A. We've got to line up to play the best of the best.'

When Clinton gets to district play, the competition, like last year, is expected to be very strong once again for the four playoff spots with Clinton, Madison Central, Northwest Rankin, Warren Central, Starkville and Provine all in the hunt.

"Last year, Warren Central, Northwest Rankin, Madison Central, all like us, had three-year starters at quarterback," said Boswell. "So, having Walker Burchfield back for us is a plus going into the season, and Hunter coming in is going to help us. They have both played in some tough games and have experience. But it is going to be tough every week. I expect the state champion team to come out of our district this year."

"The big thing is not turning the ball over on offense and giving our opponents extra possessions and a good kicking game. Field position will be a key to winning close games this year, and we do not want to give anybody a short field to score on.'

"Hopefully, these first four games will help get us more consistent and get ready for district play and get us a playoff spot. If we stay healthy and get better every week, we've got a chance to be really good once again."
