Christmas season begins with annual parade on December 2

light hours. The annual parade is a more than 40-year-old tradition, always held on the first Saturday in December.

This year’s theme, “A Disney Christmas,” encourages entrants to dress as their favorite Disney character or decorate their floats in a Disney scene. Float entries will be competing to see who can win Best Interpretation of Theme. The parade will also include a motorcycle road show, 114th military vehicles, the Hinds Hi-Steppers and several bands.

The floats and marching units will pass businesses in the Boulevard District and proceed along Clinton Boulevard, the homes of the East Clinton Historic District, and the East Campus dorms of Mississippi College toward the Clinton Parkway. After crossing the Parkway, the parade continues along College Street directly in front of the entrance of Mississippi College to its endpoint near the MC Coliseum.

Guidelines for entries include: there is only one live Santa in the parade, and he rides at the end of the parade; no candy may be thrown from floats, only handed out by marchers; music choices should follow the parade theme; and those wishing to participate should submit their entry form by Monday, November 27 with a \$25 fee to the Chamber of Commerce. After the deadline date, the entry fee is \$35. The entry form and registration fee may be mailed to P. O. Box 143, Clinton 39060 or dropped by the office at 100 East Leake Street.

This year, there will be several hot chocolate tents spread around the parade route. Two will be on Clinton Boulevard in the shopping center, and one will be on College Street in front of Cruise Planners. The business sponsors for each hot chocolate tent will serve while supplies last and will host a Disney character to greet guests.

Grand marshal of the parade is Marsha Barham. She was honored at the beginning of 2017 as Citizen of the Year by the Chamber of Commerce.

After all of the floats, bands, school and community groups have passed by thousands of cheering fans, Santa Claus will make his grand entrance into the city, accompanied by Mrs. Claus, riding on a big red fire truck.

The appearance of Santa and Mrs. Claus signals the end of the parade, but they have graciously agreed to greet their fans and pose for pictures in the gingerbread house that occupies a prominent spot on the Clinton Parkway.

For several years, the Mascagni family has positioned their gingerbread cottage at the site of their business, at the intersection of the Clinton Parkway and East Main Street, as a gift to the children of Clinton. Parents are encouraged to bring their children to talk with Santa and Mrs. Claus and snap candid pictures.
