Players anxious for the reception

Four professional football players are trying to get closer to George Sauer this year.

This group of NFL players and Wisconsin natives, including Edgerton's Derek Carrier, will gain ground on Sauer and elevate upward on the list of most-accomplished receivers from the Badger State. Sauer – a Sheboygan native – played six seasons (1965-70) for the New York Jets, catching 309 passes for 4,965 yards and 28 touchdowns to lead Wisconsin natives all-time in all three categories.

Carrier, along with fellow NFL tight ends Lance Kendricks and Austin Seferian-Jenkins, each have put in enough time to rank in the top 20 of that list and can improve their rank in the 2017 season. The fourth Wisconsin native likely to climb that ladder this season – former Badger Melvin Gordon – catches his passes out of the backfield.

Carrier became the 28th NFL player from Wisconsin to catch a touchdown pass, in the 2015 season for the Washington Redskins. Though he was limited to eight games in 2016 due to recovery from a late-season injury in 2015, his single catch last year put him in a tie for 19th on catches by a Wisconsin native, with

Fort Atkinson's Keith Neubert, who played two seasons (1988-89) with the Jets. With his next catch, Carrier will tie for 18th with Milwaukee's Noah Herron, who played for Green Bay and Pittsburgh (2005-06).

Seferian-Jenkins has reached 15th on the list in his three NFL seasons so far. The Fox Island native has 55 catches and is eighth among Wisconsin natives in touchdown receptions (seven) over his time with Tampa Bay and the Jets.

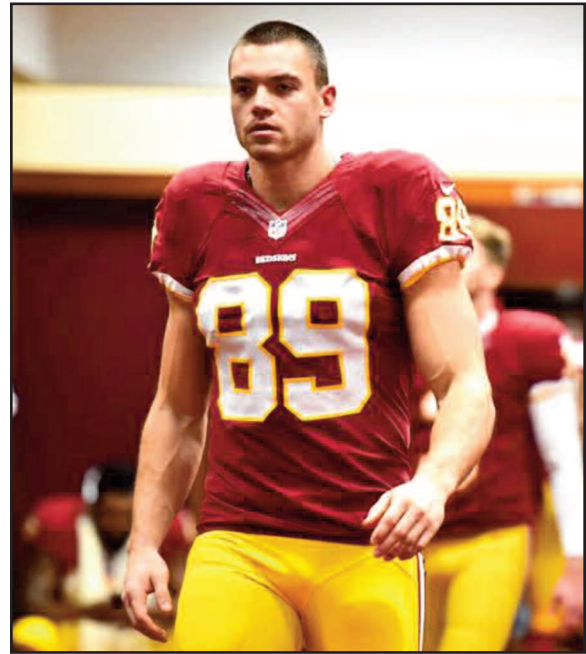
Gordon has made even more ground on this list since leaving the University of Wisconsin-Madison, despite having just two NFL seasons and getting a bulk of his touches in the run game. He has 74 catches to rank 12th entering this season and the Kenosha native is 14th in receiving yards with 611.

Kendricks is the closest to 1st-place Sauer, but would need a few more strong seasons to dethrone him. He ranks third in both catches (204) and yards (2,132); he's also tied for third in touchdowns (17) after six NFL seasons.

However, the only Wisconsin native with a chance to catch Sauer the past 20 years was former Packer and Eau Claire native Bill Schroeder. Upon retiring from the NFL in 2004, Schroeder was just five catches (304) behind

Sauer on the all-time list, along with being 382 yards behind. He did tie

Sauer for the all-time lead in touchdown receptions (28).
