"You have truly brought back Harrison's passion for hunting," said his family. "Harrison had the time of his life on his bear hunt with his new family of friends."

Fulfilling these wishes is the mission of Hunt of a Lifetime, an organization granting hunting and fishing wishes for kids up to age 21 facing lifethreatening illnesses or conditions.

Hunt of a Lifetime was founded 18 years ago by a mom who wanted to fulfill her son's dream. Battling an aggressive type of cancer, Matthew Pattison's simple wish for the future was to "Hunt moose with Dad." A big game hunt like Matt imagined would be too expensive for the family to fund, but his mother Tina Pattison was determined to help him achieve his dream hunt.

After a disappointing conversation with a wish-granting organization, Pattison decided to personally call a long list of outfitters and, after many "no's" they finally got a "yes" from Clayton Grosso, an outfitter in Nordegg, a tiny village in Alberta, Canada. The community in Nordegg rallied and truly provided a hunt of a lifetime for Matthew, who brought home a trophy bull moose. On April 28, 1999, six months after his hunting trip in Nordegg, Matthew passed away.

away. "After his passing, I decided to start a foundation that would fulfill dreams like Matt's. Hunt of a Lifetime would give terminally ill children the chance to embark on an outdoor hunting or fishing adventure," said Pattison.
