## Lyons baseball squad looks to get back to winning ways in 2017

But Lyons still won more games than it lost. Last spring, the Lions continued to backtrack, winning just four games. Coach Larry Kirkhart, back for a seventh season, wants to get that changed.

"After a disappointing season last year, it's time for the senior class to make a name for itself," he said. "We expect to be competitive and surprise some teams."

With five starters back in the lineup, Lyons has the ability to do it. Missing in action will be Jordan Douglas,

a second-team All-CKL pitcher last spring. With new pitch-count regulations, that absence could be bigger than usual.

"Pitching regulations will affect everybody so

it will be a challenge to strategize the rotation game to game," Kirkhart said.

Fortunately, Kirkhart has a wealth of arms as all six of his returning

varsity players have the ability to throw. Junior Brayden Moore and senior Tristan Heath will get their share of innings. Heath can also play in the infield or out-

field as a utility man.

Senior Tyler Edwards returns to first base as a second-team all-league selection last year. He will be among the pitchers, and he returns as a

hitting leader with a .389 average last year. Senior Riley Kirkhart is in the same boat after batting .389 last season. He returns as a second-team all-league shortstop with pitching abilities.

Senior Justin Oberle returns as another utility man who can also pitch. He batted .275 last season. Senior Nathan Robl will do most of the catching the season but can pitch as needed.

Lyons jumped right into its tough schedule with a doubleheader against perenniallytough Wichita Independent on March 28. Games three and four at Hoisington may not be much easier. A tough CKL schedule closes with two league powers from last season in Pratt on May 5 and Larned on
