Ellinwood looking to clear hurdles, get to playoffs in 2017

By Mike Courson Expectations were high for the Ellinwood football team right after a pair of wins to end the season. Those two wins - a 58-36 victory over playoff-bound Little River and a 54-6 thrashing of Canton-Galva – marked two-thirds of the Eagle win total for the season.

But with a small graduation class, the winning was supposed to carry over into 2017. Then the losses began. After the season, two players transferred to Central Plains, including Myles Menges, who had made his debut as an impressive quarterback.

Just two days into the practice season, head coach Jason Duvall was relieved of his coaching duties. With Duvall gone, sophomore Peyton Duvall, who was slated to play quarterback in 2017, transferred, leaving interim head coach Alex Birney without a quarterback.

"I think we have some guys on the team who can step in and fill the role," Birney said. "We're probably going to have to change our offense a bit to fit what we have, but I don't think it will be that big of a problem. We have a lot of experience returning on the offensive line so that helps a lot trying to get a new quarterback in the system.'

Birney took the changes in stride. A former wideout and safety for the Eagles, Birney has been around the EHS programs enough to feel confident working with the athletes under a new. bigger role.

dent in myself and our team," said Birney. "I've been around them in all three sports. I've been an assistant in football, basketball, and track ever since I moved back so I know them really well. I think we're going to have a lot of fun.

"They guys responded well to the situation we're in and we're just working really hard to do the best we can," said Birney. "I think if we just go out and do the best we can we're going to shock some people."

quarterback. Doll has played quarterback in the younger ranks and is familiar with the offense.

Leading the returning skill players will be senior Drew Blake out of the back field. Last year Ellinwood was largely a throw-first team so the state-level sprinter Blake carried the ball just 61 times for 304 yards and seven touchdowns.

"There are only two teams who have someone faster than me, so I'm hoping to be able to run all over everybody," Blake said.

Blake will have some

last year. Junior Kody Koetter earned all-league honors at center last year, and senior Colby Prescott and junior Bryce Baker also return.

'We're definitely going to end up falling on our offensive line a lot because we return all of our guys," Birney said. "(Kody) will probably be moved around somewhere because he's just a phenomenal athlete and a really good kid."

A new addition to this year's team will be senior Nathan Monday, who could play at wideout or under center. Both are positions with big shoes to fill. Menges threw for 1,814 yards and 20 touchdowns last year, and the

Eagles will be without their top-two receivers a year ago in Tyson Martinez and Duvall, who accounted for more than 1,200 of the team's 1,814 receiving yards.

Ellinwood remains in a competitive district that features Central Plains and Little River. Central Plains returns a stacked lineup in search of a fifthstraight playoff run, and Little River returns most of its squad albeit under a new coach.

"I really think we'll be able to make it to the playoffs this year," Blake said. "I think we have a very good opportunity and I really think our record is going to be pretty good."
