Lions look to bounce back from 1-20 season

By Mike Courson Last winter the Lyons boys had to wait until the end of January for a Homecoming win against Ellinwood. That proved to be the team's first and last win of a disappointing 1-20 season. Coach Brian Friess, back for an 18th season on the sideline, has a mix of five starters back to enter the 2017-18 campaign with more optimism.

"We look to be more competitive this season," he said. "Last year was a rough year... our biggest problem was, and will continue to be, scoring. We are hopeful some kids put in the time in the off-season shooting that is necessary to be competitive in the CKL."

That scoring problem amounted to about 34 points a night last year for the Lions. Friess loses his top scorer in four-year player Tyler Edwards, who earned an All-CKL honorable mention last year after putting in 10.2 points a game. Also missing this year will be three-year guys Nathan Robl and Riley Kirkhart, who combined for another three points a game.

Leading this year's group will be senior Terek Smith. The quarterback was second on the team last year in scoring at 8.3 pgg, and his 4.2 rebounds a night were also second best on the team. At 6-2, 200, Smith brings athleticism and experience to the squad. He was also an all-league honorable mention a year

Senior Jonathan Gomez (6-1, 190) was third on the team last year in scoring at 3.5 ppg, and fourth on the squad with two rebounds a night. Junior Brayden Fundenberger picked up some starting experience last year and enters this season as the big man on the roster at 6-3. Sophomores Alejandro Pena (5-7) and Connor Minix (6-0) also saw starts in their first varsity seasons last winter. That duo combined for about five points a game.

Friess will also have back senior Wlisses Landeros (5-10), who missed last season due to a football injury. Junior Gage Reid (5-10), who averaged nearly a point a night last year, also returns

"We look for Smith, Gomez, Fundenberger, Reid, Minix, and Pena to be much stronger than last season," Friess said. "We look forward to Landeros returning after missing his junior year due to a football injury. We think sophomore Aaron Gomez may be a 'sleeper' this year. He has looked really good early season!

"We may have to bring a couple more freshmen up to the JV/ varsity level as we have only six upperclassmen and five who have any experience."

Besides a handful of returners with starting experience, Friess has another reason to be optimistic. In summer league, the team posted an 8-2 record at McPherson College to win its division.

"We hope to build on at." Friess said. "Most of the aforementioned kids were a big part of that summer league team."

The Central Kansas League again looks to be tough each night out. Smoky Valley follows up a successful football season with a No. 7 preseason ranking in Class 4A, Div. II. Hesston is ranked No. 3 in 3A, and Hillsboro enters the season ranked No. 10 in Class 2A. Pratt played at state last winter, and the Sterling Invite usually features tough competition.

leap in that direction. "Going in, I would expect us to be very competitive each and every night we take the floor," Hollinger said. "The girls spent a lot of time playing together this summer and grew a lot from that. rebounds a night. Back to lead a team that went 7-15 last winter is another four-year player in senior Bailey Hollinger, who earned an All-CKL honorable mention after scoring 10 points and grabbing five boards a night. Hollinger has been a major 3-point threat in her career.

Sophomore Kristina Head established herself will see each of those teams at least once, with Haven listed twice on the schedule. Larned and Pratt are ranked in Class 4A, Div. II, and the Lady Lions will see a ranked Moundridge team early on in the season. "Each and every

night in the CKL is a tough night," Hollinger said. "The CKL

is always loaded with talent. But, those games are the games that help us get ready for postseason play."

Lyons opens the season tonight against Ellsworth, and Hollinger is anxious to see what her team has tonight and beyond.

"I am looking forward to seeing the girls back at it again," she said. "They worked hard this summer and grew through the many games we played. There were some tough ones and some moments that the girls learned a lot from. I am truly ready to see what they learned from the offseason put
