
They also got to walk through a horse trailer and see what kind of feed ponies ate. All the kids got to lead a pony as well as groom. Most of them groomed and handled one

Monday, Oct. 16, through Friday, Nov. 3. The last day to register as a voter was Tuesday, Oct. 10. All regis-

tered voters within the City of Lakeland can vote for both the mayor's race as well as all six of the city council posts. Lakeland's City Charter provides that all city council positions are "at large" which means that every city voter can vote for each councilman post. Tuesday, Nov. 7, is the general election date. On that day, voters will cast their votes at the Threatte Center, 209 US-221 or S. Valdosta Highway at Burnt Church Rd. from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.
